REPUBLICA OVERPRINT 1915

ISSUE

In Angola, the remaining stock of Luis and Carlos Neto surcharged stamps had received a local san-serif "REPUBLICA" overprint in 1914, now the postal authorities in Lisbon acted to overprint their remaining stock of Luis and Carlos Neto surcharged stamps. A serif "REPUBLICA" overprint in red was applied at the State mint in Lisbon, and released in 1915 to sell alongside the new Ceres issue. The overprint was the same as was applied to the Carlos Mouchon stamps for release in 1911. All stamps were released gummed, except the 130/75 in Chalk-surfaced paper.

ERRORS

Unlike the local Angolan "REPUBLICA" issue, the "REPUBLICA" overprint from the State mint was better supervised and not as much printer's waste was removed from the mint. None-the-less, some examples of doubled, inverted and displaced overprints found their way onto the market.
