REPUBLICA OVERPRINT ISSUE 1915 - Congo

ISSUE

As with the 1915 Angolan surcharges, the postal authorities in Lisbon acted to overprint their old stock of redundant stamps, in this case two Carlos Mouchon $\mathcal{PROVISORIO}$ issues, and the surcharged 50/65, as well as the Carlos Neto surcharges. A serif "REPUBLICA" overprint in red was applied at the State mint in Lisbon, and released in 1915 to sell alongside the new Ceres issue. The overprint was the same as the one applied to the Carlos Mouchon stamps released in 1911.

ERRORS

Examples of doubled, inverted and displaced overprints found their way onto the market eg., inverted 130/5. The parted 5 is found on the 50/65 surcharge.
