HONOURING THE STATUE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA. 1948

ISSUE.

A commemorative stamp on the appearance of the Holy Mother Mary to Fatima. Designed by Almada Nageiros and printed by the Litografia Nacional in Porto on shiny paper with light coloured gum. Panes of 100 stamps with printer noted on the border of the sheet. All Portuguese colonies were represented for this issue, Mozambique with 4 stamps and the other Colonies with 1 stamp each. Print run 60,000 to 150,000

TERCENTENARY OF THE RESTORATION OF ANGOLA. 1948

ISSUE.

Designed by A. de Sousa and printed litho by Litografia Maia. Oporto, Portugal. This was a technically faultless product. The inscription is as follows - Tricentenario da Restauracao de Angola 1648-1948. The horizontal designs show local scenes: Our Lady of Nazareth Hermitage at Luanda, The surrender of Luanda, Inscribed rocks at Yeiala and at Massangano fortress. The vertical designs in ascending values: Don John, Salvador Correia de Sa Benevides, Dioga Cao, Manuel Cerveira Pereira and Paulo Dias de Novais. The restoration of Angola to Portugal was accomplished against the Dutch who had captured Luanda in 1641. Its recapture by the Portuguese in 1648 was followed by strong pressure on the Ngola of Matamba and the breaking of tribal power in 1671. The dismantling of the Ndongo kingdom to the West followed two years later, followed by Colonisation and increasing Portuguese control until challenged in the late 60's with independence in 1975. Issued in May. Print run 150,000 to 500,000.
